Exhibitors Rules

1. Competition is open to residents of Minnesota
2. Entered items must have been made or grown within the past two years by the exhibitor.
3. An exhibitor may have only one entry in a class, but can enter as many different classes as desired.
4. Management reserves the right to divide a class if the number of entries is excessive with approval of a Board member.
5. First, second and third placing will be awarded to exhibits according to their judged worthiness. Inferior exhibits will not be awarded premiums.
6. Do not attach exhibitor's name to entry.
7. Entry day is Wednesday June 15th noon to 8:00 p.m. No admission fee.
8. All articles are to remain on exhibit until 5:00 p.m. Sunday, June 19th , or the premium will be forfeited.
9. The Society will take every precaution in its power to preserve the articles on display, but will not be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur in the delivery, exhibition or removal of the exhibit.
10. The Fair Board, at the Judges request, reserves the right to disqualify or remove from competition any exhibit.
11. 4–H members are encouraged to compete in Creative Activities Classes, but the same item cannot be entered in both Creative Activities and 4–H Departments.
12. All participants in seniors and youth classes are encouraged to enter other appropriate classes.
13. The Agriculture Society reserves the right to amend or add to there rules, as they may deem necessary.
14. All exhibits must be picked up by 8:00 p.m. Sunday, June 19th , or make prior arrangements. Exhibits will not be held for.
15. Prize awards are \$4.00, \$3.00, \$2.00, unless otherwise indicated.
16. Pre-registration is recommended and encouraged, you will be required to wait for entry tags to be printed.
17. Prize award in each Sweepstakes Division will be as follows: Blue \$10.00 Red \$7.50 White \$ 5.00
18. For all children, youth, senior citizen class entries, select an item listed in the class for that division.
19. All Judge's decisions are final. No interference with judges during the judging process.
20. All entries must have been entered in fair computer program, no hand written tags.

Division III Digital Arts

Class 1- 5

1. Digital Photographic Compositing

Digital Photographic Compositing is the use of photographic images from a variety of shots utilized to create the final scene. The final piece could be a collage or take on the feel of a surrealistic photographic scene. However, the final piece must be photographic in nature.

2. Photo Manipulation

Photographic sources altered with digital special effects or filters. Images for this category are for work that could look photographic, abstract or painterly. The process should entail photographic image or images where digital effects and filters are used to go beyond a photographic look. Appropriate techniques include digital images with more sophisticated layering techniques of imagery, photos smudged or cloned to look like paintings but which maintain the composition of the original photographs, filter effects on digital photos or modifications of color, such as posterizing, extreme saturation or de-saturation.

3. Painting and Illustration

Images created from scratch in a digital program; Photoshop, Illustrator or Freehand. Original work, primarily not from manipulated photographs. Photos may be used as reference but may not be a noticeable element of the final composition or layout. If any part of the image is photographic, or if it is a photograph manipulated to look like a painting, it should be placed into Photo Manipulation.

Work may be painted, drawn and contain abstract imagery that reflects originality.

4. Digital Panoramics

Images stitched together using programs like Photoshop, Autopano and PT Gui to create a single vision of a photographic theme. The size of the matboard may be any size to 24" maximum on the longest side. The final presentation could be an elongated vertical (long and narrow), horizontal or square, with a maximum of 24" in any direction.

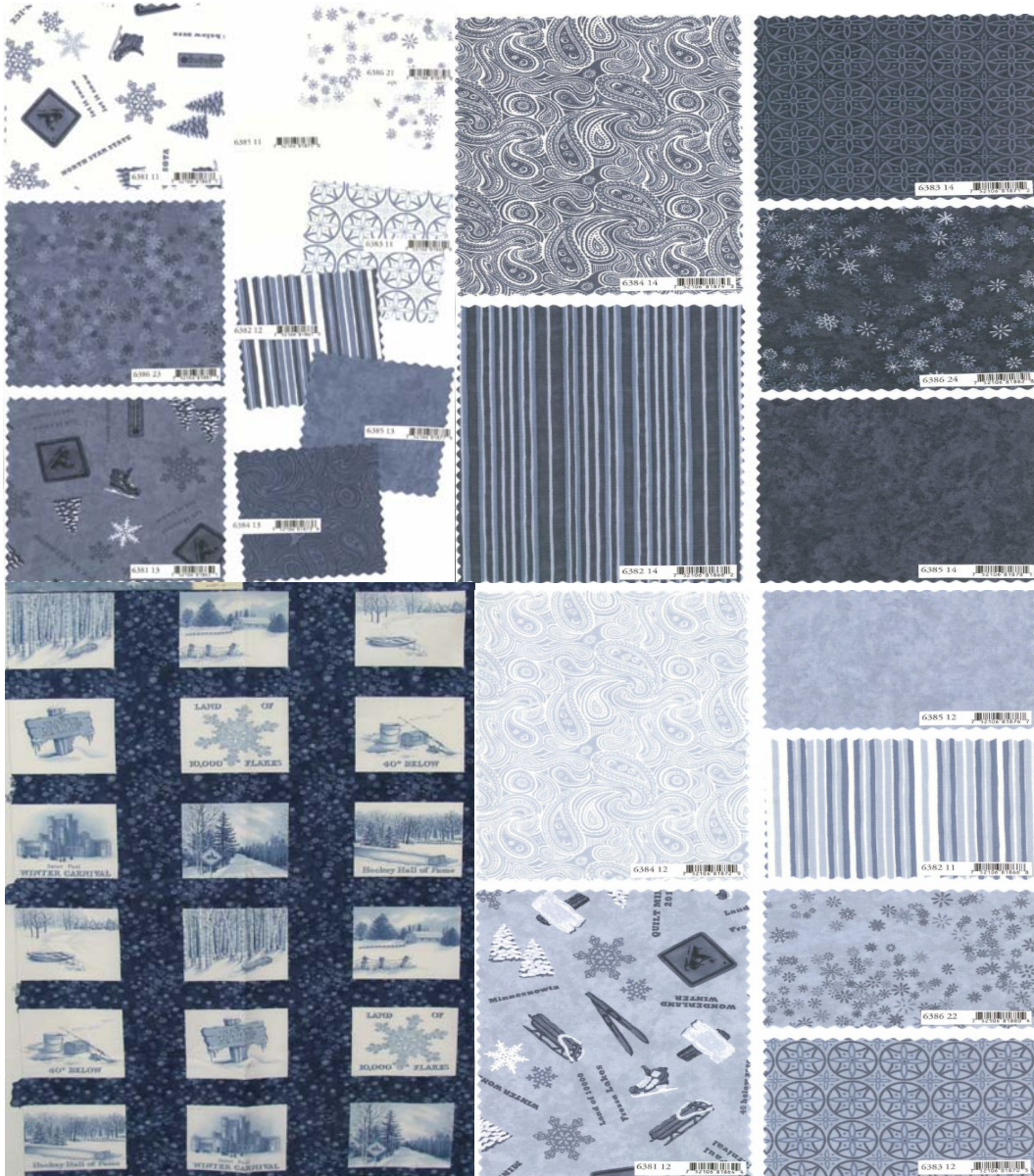
